Events

Dunbar

On Sunday 31st July Derek Read will lead a battlefield tour taking in some of the key sites of the Battle of Dunbar (1650). This important battle saw Cromwell's New Model Army defeat a numerically superior Royalist force under David Leslie. Meet at 13:00 in the ASDA car park just off the A1 near Dunbar. Philiphaugh

Over the weekend of 13/14th August The Sealed Knot are staging a re-enactment of the Battle of Philiphaugh (1645) on the battlefield site where David Leslie (at this point fighting against the Royalists) defeated the Marquis of Montrose. Philiphaugh is close to Selkirk in the Scottish Borders. This event is a part of a major new community project to investigate, preserve and promote this site. Newburn Ford



The Sealed Knot are staging a re-enactment of the Battle of Newburn Ford (1640) close to the battlefield site which is on the River Tyne, west of Newcastle over the weekend of 24/25th September. This was the only battle of the Second Bishops' War in which the Scots resisted attempts by Charles I to reform the Scottish church. There will be plenty to see including drill displays and skirmishes involving the use of cannon, muskets, pike and cavalry. For further information please phone (0191) 2648501

Further Ahead

Looking ahead we are planning an event at Otterburn for spring 2012. This will centre on the WW1 practice trenches at Otterburn Ranges but will also include something related to the battle of 1388.
